Dear Mr. Mayor,

Please allow me to draw your kind attention to an art project currently realised by the German artist Wolfgang Kraker von Schwarzenfeld, the Global Stone Project.

The project aims to bring sculptured rocks from the five continents to Berlin, the German Capital, and to set up a twin rock on the continent of its origin. The perception of the project by the artist is that of a symbolic sign for world peace through unity. All five stone pairs are going to represent the five steps towards peace and the African rock is going to stand for "hope". As a country that shares and is inspired by the strong and humanising feeling of hope, the artist has chosen South Africa - and her Mother City - as the most suitable place for the African rock.

The German Capital lends its full support to the realisation of the project. The competent local authorities in Berlin have officially reserved a highly prominent and outstanding location for this work of art in the very centre of Berlin. The five rocks are to be erected in close neighbourhood to the world famous Brandenburg Gate and the planned Holocaust Memorial. The German Parliament the "Reichstag" is only a mere 1 000 metres away. The two rocks representing Australia and America are already in place on the site.

I would therefore be most happy if also in South Africa an appropriate and equal site could be made available for the set-up of the African rock.
